



Healthcare for refugees from Ukraine: updated to Monday 7th March 2022

- Healthcare is guaranteed for free to everyone who have health needs for acute or chronic illnesses.
- On arrival you do not have to observe a period of quarantine.
- **Everybody must take a nasopharyngeal swab test for SARS-CoV-2 within 48 hours after entering Italy.** For the test you need to go to any of all of the drive-through testing site of ASST (Punti tampone), where you can also receive FFP2 face masks for free. You will get the swab test for free and without reservation.
- After the swab test, if negative, if you are aged 6 or over you must wear an FFP2 face mask for 5 days. FFP2 masks must be worn on all means of transports. If positive, you must observe a mandatory isolation period.
- Afterwards, in case of fever and/or respiratory symptoms outbreak, you must take a nasopharyngeal swab test for SARS-CoV-2, free of charge and without reservation, at any of the drive-through testing site of ASST (Punti tampone).
- **Minors, pregnant women and those who have a visa issued in the Schengen Area can register to the Regional Health Service (SSR) by going to any of the "Sportelli scelta e revoca" of ASST** and obtain the issue of a temporary health card. With such health card, you can go to any family doctor or pediatrician on the territory, free of charge, also for the prescription of medicines or diagnostic checks.
- To this day the other Ukrainian refugees cannot register to the Regional Health Service yet, but can obtain the **STP code, which is necessary to receive services and prescriptions of drugs at the SSR's expenses**, by going to any of the "Sportelli scelta e revoca" of ASST.
- Only for sanitary **emergency/urgency**, the single emergency number 112 is active, as well as the services of ER (Pronto Soccorso).
- **You must receive the vaccination against SARS-CoV-2:** to get the first and second dose or the booster dose of the **COVID-19 vaccine, which will enable you to get your Green Pass**, you need to go to the **Covid Vaccination Sites** of ASST (Centri vaccinali Covid). The vaccination is free and without reservation.
- **It is important to check all the other vaccinations**, both for children and adults, by going to the **non-Covid Vaccination Sites of ASST**.
- Women who are **pregnant** or have **gynaecological problems** can access for free to the **family counselling Centre (Consultorio familiare)** of ASST.

Ukrainian refugees who are not registered to the Regional Health Service (SSR) and with acute and/or chronic illnesses who need healthcare can go to the **sanitary first-aid point**, directly and free of charge, where they will be examined by a doctor. The point is located on viale Duca degli Abruzzi 13 in Brescia and is active from Friday 4th March, from Monday to Friday, from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm.

This first-aid point is reserved to refugees with sanitary needs (not administrative needs).
